Violation(s) / Comment(s) (Chapter 3717-1 OAC violations checked)

Follow-up inspection conducted . The following violations have been corrected or addressed:

- 1. Fish and other foods stored in location or covered to protect from cross contamination. Food in meat room separated to protect from cross contamination.**
- 2. Chipped plates have been discarded.**
- 3. Food contact surfaces of slicers, prep sink, meat slicer and other utensils kept clean at time of inspection.**
- 4. Hot food held in line hot box above 135°F and in proper temperature.**
- 5. Food carts and racks kept clean of debris.**
- 6. Dishmachine area kept clean, meat room shelves and walls have been cleaned.**
- 7. Walk-in cooler shelves and hard to reach areas have been cleaned.**
- 8. Inside of hot box next to fry line has been cleaned. Hard to reach areas of fryers have been cleaned.**
- 9. Flour and other dry baking items kept in closed containers.**
- 10. Walk-in cooler doors and handles kept clean to protect hands from contamination when opening.**
- 11. Pans and food containers stored inverted to protect from splash, spills, or contamination.**

04.1 Equipment, Utensils, and Linens: Design and Construction

(A) Equipment and utensils - durability and strength.

Observed several cracked food container lids in use and cracked food containers. Discard any chipped or cracked food container to prevent food from possible physical contamination. Equipment and utensils shall be designed and constructed to be durable and to retain their characteristic qualities under normal use conditions.

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04.5 Equipment, Utensils, and Linens: Cleaning of Equipment and Utensils

(C) Cooking and baking equipment - cleaning frequency.

Observed several baking pans encrusted with grease. The food-contact surfaces of cooking and baking equipment shall be cleaned at least every twenty-four hours. When cleaning, ensure encrusted grease is removed from pans to prevent such accumulation.

04.5 Equipment, Utensils, and Linens: Cleaning of Equipment and Utensils

(A) Equipment, food-contact surfaces, nonfood-contact surfaces, and utensils.

Some areas of line equipment and hard to reach areas of equipment still dirty to sight and touch.

Nonfood-contact surfaces of equipment shall be kept free of an accumulation of dust, dirt, food residue, and other debris.

05.4 Water, Plumbing, and Waste: Refuse, Recyclables, and Returnables

(P) Maintaining refuse areas and enclosures.

Outdoor dumpster area has accumulation of trash and debris under ramp. Clean routinely to prevent such accumulation. A storage area and enclosure for refuse, recyclables, or returnables shall be maintained clean and free of unnecessary items, as specified under paragraph (N) of rule 3717-1-06.4 of the Administrative Code.

06.4 Physical Facilities: Maintenance and Operation

(B) Cleaning - frequency and restrictions.

Hard to reach areas of kitchen walls, floor, and ceiling still have accumulation of debris. Continue cleaning daily to prevent such accumulation. The physical facilities shall be cleaned as often as necessary to keep them clean.

Random follow-up inspection will be conducted in 7-14 days to ensure remaining violations are corrected and other violations remain corrected. An administrative hearing is scheduled for Tuesday June 22, 2010 at 9:00am at the Ross County Health District, 475 Western Ave, Chillicothe, OH 45601 to discuss action plan for abatement of violations noted on this inspection and previous inspections.

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
