Violation(s) / Comment(s) (Chapter 3717-1 OAC violations checked)

1) Observed debris build-up on the beverage syrup racks. Observed debris build-up on the metal racks in the walk-in coolers. Observed food debris build-up on the inside of the prep freezer beside the grill. All equipment must be cleaned at a frequency to prevent debris build-up and must remain clean to sight and touch. Cleaning of the equipment began at the time of inspection.

3717-1-04.5 Equipment, Utensils, and Linens: Cleaning of Equipment and Utensils

(A) Equipment, food-contact surfaces, nonfood-contact surfaces, and utensils.

(3) Nonfood-contact surfaces of equipment shall be kept free of an accumulation of dust, dirt, food residue, and other debris.

2) Observed debris build-up on the floor under the syrup racks, along the floor and wall junctions by the rear exit door, on the walk-in freezer floor, and in the dry storage area. The physical facility and hard to reach areas must remain clean to sight and touch.

3717-1-06.4 Physical Facilities: Maintenance and Operation

(B) Cleaning - frequency and restrictions.

(1) The physical facilities shall be cleaned as often as necessary to keep them clean.

Observed the dumpster lids open at the time of inspection. The dumpster lids must remain closed at all times to prevent the attraction and harborage of rodents and pests.

3717-1-05.4 Water, Plumbing, and Waste: Refuse, Recyclables, and Returnables

(N) Covering receptacles.

Receptacles and waste handling units for refuse, recyclables, or returnables shall be kept covered:

(2) With tight-fitting lids or doors if kept outside the food service operation or retail food establishment.

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4) Observed debris around the dumpster area. The dumpster area must be kept free of debris build-up to prevent the attraction of rodents and pests.

3717-1-05.4 Water, Plumbing, and Waste: Refuse, Recyclables, and Returnables

(P) Maintaining refuse areas and enclosures.

A storage area and enclosure for refuse, recyclables, or returnables shall be maintained clean and free of unnecessary items, as specified under paragraph (N) of rule 3717-1-06.4 of the Administrative Code.

5) ***CRITICAL VIOLATION*** Observed food debris build-up on the inside of the microwave across from the grill. Observed food debris build-up on the food contact surfaces of the clean plates under the grill line. The clean plates must be turned over to prevent debris build-up on their food contact surfaces. All food contact surfaces must remain clean to sight and touch to prevent possible contamination of the food. The cleaning of these items began at the time of the inspection.

3717-1-04.5 Equipment, Utensils, and Linens: Cleaning of Equipment and Utensils

(B) Equipment food-contact surfaces and utensils - cleaning frequency.

(1) Equipment food-contact surfaces and utensils shall be cleaned:

(e) At any time during the operation when contamination may have occurred.

SUMMARY

Cold holding temperatures appear to be in the proper range of below 41 degrees F. Hot holding temperatures appear to be in the proper range of above 135 degrees F. Hot water appears to be adequate in all handwash sinks. The dish washing machine appears to be operating properly at the time of inspection. Hair restraints and single use gloves appear to be worn properly. Test strips and thermometer available at the time of inspection.

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
