Food Service Inspection Summary

VIOLATIONS NOTED

1. Seal was missing from the bottom of the rear entry door.
2. Egg rolls were stored on top of paper menus in the walk-in and prep coolers.
3. Tin cans were used to scoop rice out of the large storage containers.
4. Observed dirt and dust build-up on the PVC drainage pipe in the walk-in cooler.
5. Observed debris build-up on the floor and wall junctions behind equipment such as tables and prep coolers.
6. Observed shrimp and other potentially hazardous food stored above 41 degrees F. in the prep coolers.

ACTIONS TAKEN OR ORDERED

1. A seal must be placed on the bottom of the rear entry door.
2. The owner was told that the egg rolls can only be stored on or in approved food storage containers.
3. The owner was told that cans cannot be used to scoop the rice. The scoop must be made of approved, smooth, and easily cleanable material.
4. The hard to reach areas must be cleaned at a frequency to prevent dirt and debris build-up and must remain clean to the sight and touch.
5. The owner was told to lower prep cooler temperature so all food is held at 41 degrees F or below during the cold holding process.

SANITARIAN'S SUMMARY OF INSPECTION

Hot holding temperatures appeared to be above 135 degrees F. The cleanliness and overall maintenance of the facility has greatly improved since the last inspection. The owner attempted to correct the above violations at the time of the inspection.
